Grace For The Condemned! Faces Of Grace, Pt. 1

John 8:2-11 June 5, 2016

GRACE - God's favor toward those who are unworthy!

John 8:2, At dawn He appeared again in the temple courts, where all the people gathered around Him, and He sat down to teach them. ³The teachers of the law and the Pharisees brought in a woman caught in adultery. They made her stand before the group ⁴ and said to Jesus, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the act of adultery. ⁵In the Law Moses commanded us to stone such women. Now what do you say?" ⁶They were using this question as a trap, in order to have a basis for accusing Him. But Jesus bent down and started to write on the ground with His finger ⁷When they kept on questioning Him, He straightened up and said to them, "Let any one of you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." ⁸Again He stooped down and wrote on the ground. ⁹At this, those who heard began to go away one at a time, the older ones first, until only Jesus was left, with the woman still standing there. ¹⁰Jesus straightened up and asked her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" 11 "No one, sir," she said. "Then neither do I condemn you," Jesus declared. "Go now and leave your life of sin." (Ephesians 2:8-10; 2 Corinthians 5:19-20)

As Christ's Ambassadors, We Must Minister Like Christ:

1) We Must Imitate His WISDOM

(John 8:3-6)

Exodus 20:14, You shall not commit adultery.

<u>Leviticus 20:10</u>, If a man commits adultery with another man's wife ... both the adulterer and the adulteress must be put to death.

2) We Must Imitate His WORDS

(John 8:7-9)

<u>Deuteronomy 17:7</u>, The hands of the witnesses must be the first in putting him to death...

3) We Must Imitate His **GRACE**

(John 8:10-11)

• Forgiveness Does Not Imply A License To SIN

Romans 6:1, What shall we say, then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase? ²By no means!

<u>Psalm 85:10</u>, Love and faithfulness meet together; righteousness and peace kiss each other.

4) We Must Imitate His MISSION

<u>John 8:11b</u>, ... "Then neither do I condemn you," Jesus declared. "<u>Go now and leave your life of sin</u>."

- 1. Am I taking more pleasure in condemnation or restoration?
- 2. Am I being affected by peer pressure?
- **3.** Am I saying what Christ would say and acting how Christ would act?
- **4.** Am I casting a Christ-like shadow on this situation?
