Using a paper plate/paper help your child make a horn to represent the horns the priests were carrying in our Bible lesson we learned today! Roll the paper plate or paper into a horn shape and tape/staple together. Let your child decorate their horn however they choose. When they are done you can attach a string to your trumpet!

SUPPLIES NEEDED:

Jericho picture

Brown paper

Glue

Crayons/markers



INSTRUCTIONS:

Give your child a sheet of paper, a sheet of dark brown paper and a Joshua cutout. Let them color the Joshua cutout then have them glue it to the far bottom left of their paper. Next have them tear their dark brown paper into SMALL pieces. When they are done have them begin gluing them on top of one another to look like a wall. Talk to them about how high the wall must have been when it came tumbling down.
