1st-5th Grade Small Group Lesson

Session Title: Jesus Was Born

Bible Passage: Luke 2:1-20

Main Point: Jesus was born to be God's promised Savior.

Key Passage: 1 John 4:9


Big Picture Question: Why was Jesus born? Jesus was born to rescue us from sin.

Christ Connection: The birth of Jesus was good news! Jesus was not an ordinary baby. He was God's Son, sent to earth from heaven. Jesus came into the world to save people from their sins and to be their King.

Hop to Bethlehem Activity

Form two teams and invite them to line up single file. Designate "Bethlehem" as the table or wall. Explain that the first person in each line must hop to "Bethlehem," touch it, hop back and tell the next person in line, "The Savior is born!" Then move to the back of the line and the next person will hop to Bethlehem. The first team to complete the task wins.

The Bible says that after the angels had given the shepherds the good news of Jesus' birth, the shepherds went quickly to find Mary, Joseph, and Jesus. They were excited to see Jesus for themselves. When they saw Jesus, they were so excited that they told everyone about everything they had seen. They were among the first people to tell the good news: Jesus was born to be God's promised Savior.

- Why is Jesus' birth still celebrated today?
