

## **Bible Focus: Jonah Tells About God**

**Verse:** Obey the commands of the Lord your God...Do what the Lord says is good. Deuteronomy 6:17-18

**Bible Point:** God helps us tell about Him.

Today we learned about Jonah and how he ran from God. We learned there is no running or hiding from God, We learned that even deep inside the ocean, inside the belly of fish, God is there. Jonah prayed for three days for God to forgive him. Can you imagine how scary it was to be inside that fish? To sit inside its belly would have been all slimy with chewed up bits of fish and see weed. But God is faithful, he heard Jonah's prayers and brought him out of the fish.

### **Supplies Needed:**

**Paper Plate**

**Blue paint/crayons**

**Paper**

**Scissors**

**Glue**



### **Instructions:**

Give your child a paper plate and let them paint or color it blue! Help your child cut a triangle piece out of a paper plate to look like a whales open mouth. Use the triangle cutout and glue it to the back of the plate to make a whale tail. Draw an eye on the whale. Let your child draw a Jonah picture and help them cut it out and place it in the whales stomach. They can also draw fish, shells etc. to put in the whales stomach a well!

## **Bible Focus:** Jonah Tells About God

### **SUPPLIES NEEDED:**

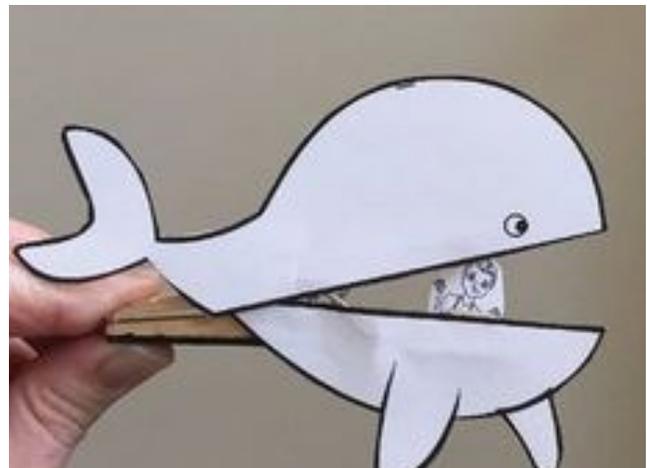
**Clothes Pin**

### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

Print out the attached Jonah and whale printout. Let your child color both images and help them cut them out. Cut the whale horizontally in half at his mouth line. Glue each half of the whale to the clothespin. Make sure both halves line up. Also make sure that you glue only the edge of each half-whale to one half of the clothespin. Glue Jonah on the reverse side of the clothespin so that he peaks out from the whales mouth when you open the clothespin
