1st-5th Grade Small Group Lesson

Session Title: Paul Before Rulers

Bible Passage: Acts 24:22-27; 25:1-14; 26:24-32

Main Point: Paul preached about Jesus to governors and kings.

Key Passage: Philippians 1:20-21

Big Picture Question: When should we tell others about Jesus? We should

always tell others about Jesus even when it is difficult.

Christ Connection: God had chosen Paul to take the gospel to Gentiles, kings, and the Israelites. (Acts 9:15-16) Paul met with people again and again to tell the good news about Jesus. He wanted everyone to believe that Jesus is Lord. Because Jesus has the power to save people from sin, Paul was willing to do whatever it took to share the gospel.

Missionary Activity

Materials: Missionary information Sheet, World Map, Gospel Plan Poster, & index cards (1 index card per person)

Show the group the Missionary information sheet below. This is some missionaries that our church supports who are currently serving in different parts of the world. Show the group the World map below to help recognize the distance and how they are all around the world sharing the Gospel. Talk about what difficult things these missionaries may face as they share Jesus with others. Then guide the group to pray for each of these missionaries, asking God to protect them and give them courage to honor Christ in all they do. Pray for missionaries and other believers who are sharing the gospel in these places.

We can share the Gospel wherever we are, across the world or right here in Allen, Texas. Give everyone an index card and encourage the group to think of a friend that they would like to pray for and share who Jesus is. Ask them to write the name on the 3X5 index card to remind them to pray for them.

Review The Gospel Plan motions with the group to help them feel comfortable in sharing the Gospel with others. The Gospel Plan Poster is attached below.

Motions:

- God rules [Place hands in a circle over you, as though setting a crown on your head.]
- We sinned [Hold both arms in front of you making a large X with your forearms.]
- God provided [Turn your X into a cross by rotating your arms.]
- Jesus gives [Hold hands together in front of you as though handing someone a gift.]
- We respond [Raise both hands into the air in celebration and praise.]

A missionary is a Christian called by God who obeys and goes to tell another group of people the good news about Jesus. Whether it's in the USA or another country, the Bible says to go and tell others about Jesus. When Paul was arrested, God protected him so he could preach about Jesus. Even today, missionaries risk their lives to tell others about Jesus. Let's pray for them as they trust and obey Jesus.

Kenya



GOD RULES.

The Bible tells us God created everything, including you and me, and He is in charge of everything. Genesis 1:1; Revelation 4:11; Colossians 1:16-17

We all choose to disobey God. The Bible calls this sin. Sin separates us from God and deserves God's punishment of death. Romans 3:23; 6:23

GOD PROVIDED.

God sent Jesus, the perfect solution to our sin problem, to rescue us from the punishment we deserve. It's something we, as sinners, could never earn on our own. Jesus alone saves us. John 3:16; Ephesians 2:8-9

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." —John 3:16



JESUS GIVES.

He lived a perfect life, died on the cross for our sins, and rose again. Because Jesus gave up His life for us, we can be welcomed into God's family for eternity. This is the best gift ever! Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21; 1 Peter 3:18; Ephesians 2:8-9

WE RESPOND.

Believe in your heart that Jesus alone saves you through what He's already done on the cross. Repent, turning from self and sin to Jesus. Tell God and others that your faith is in Jesus. John 14:6; Romans 10:9-10,13
