BIBLE STORY

From 1 Samuel 16:14-23

Saul was the first king of Israel. Sometimes Saul did not feel well. One day, Saul asked the people who worked for him to find someone who could play a harp. One of the king's helpers said, "I know a man named Jesse. He has a son who plays the harp."

King Saul sent some messengers to Jesse. Jesse sent for his son David, who was watching seep. David went to the king's home. David played his harp for King Saul and helped hum. Whenever King Saul was unhappy, David would play his harp.



SPECIAL HELPER.

Write kid-friendly jobs on slips of paper, such as "Get the mail", "Help with dinner", or "Put toys away". Fold the slips of paper and place them in a container. Give each child an opportunity to draw our a "Special Helper" job each day. Find small ways to award jobs completed. At the end of the week, discuss how you can look for opportunities to be special helpers.

FAMILY FUN

Working together is a GREAT way to encourage children to tackle their jobs with enthusiasm. Demonstrating how to help one another is a powerful teaching tool. Affirming a "job well done" goes a long way to encourage a child to do their best work. Resist the temptation to compare the quality of work of two or more family members. Instead,

encourage each individual to do the best they can do.

Allow reasonable amounts of time for jobs to be completed. Remind family members that doing the best they can do is part of making right choices. God is pleased when we make right choices and help others.
