BIBLE STORY

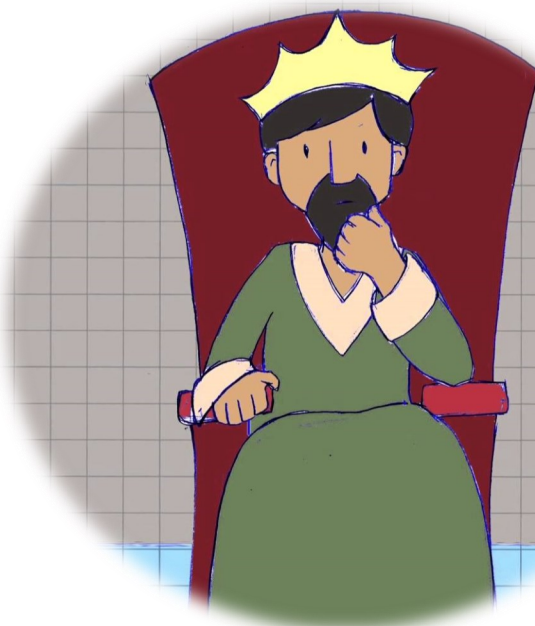
From 1 Kings 3:4-15; 4:29-34

When King David became old, he chose his son Solomon to be the next king. Solomon wanted to be a good king. One night

God spoke to Solomon in a dream. God said, "Ask me for anything you want. I will give it to you."

Solomon did not ask God to make him rich or famous. He did not ask to live a long time. Solomon asked God to help him to know right from wrong.

God was please. God said, "I will give what you asked." God made Solomon a wise, rich, and famous king.



FAMILY FUN

King Solomon could have asked God for anything he wanted, but he made the choice to ask for wisdom. God cares about the choices we make.

Think about how you and your family make choices. Do you spend time as a family asking God to help you know right from wrong?

Involve your entire family in asking God to help in making right choices. Lead your child to ask for God's help in the daily choices they are making. Seeking God's help with daily family choices will demonstrate to your child that you depend on God just like Solomon.

RIGHT OR WRONG?

Take turns acting out family situations that display right or wrong choices. Examples: brushing teeth (right choice), hitting a friend (wrong choice), sharing with a sister (right choice), writing on the wall (wrong choice). Have the rest of the family guess what action is being done. Show thumbs-up if an action displays a right choice or thumbs-down if the action is a wrong choice.

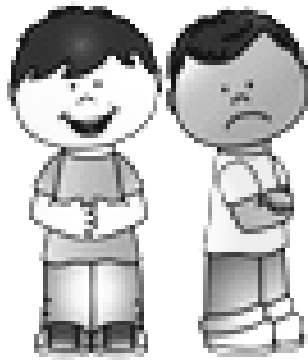

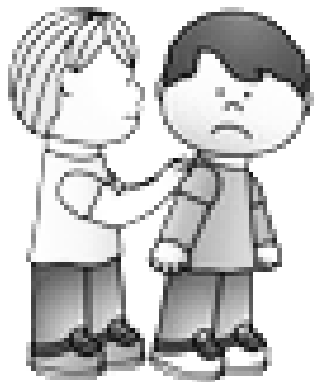
WHAT CAN I DO?
