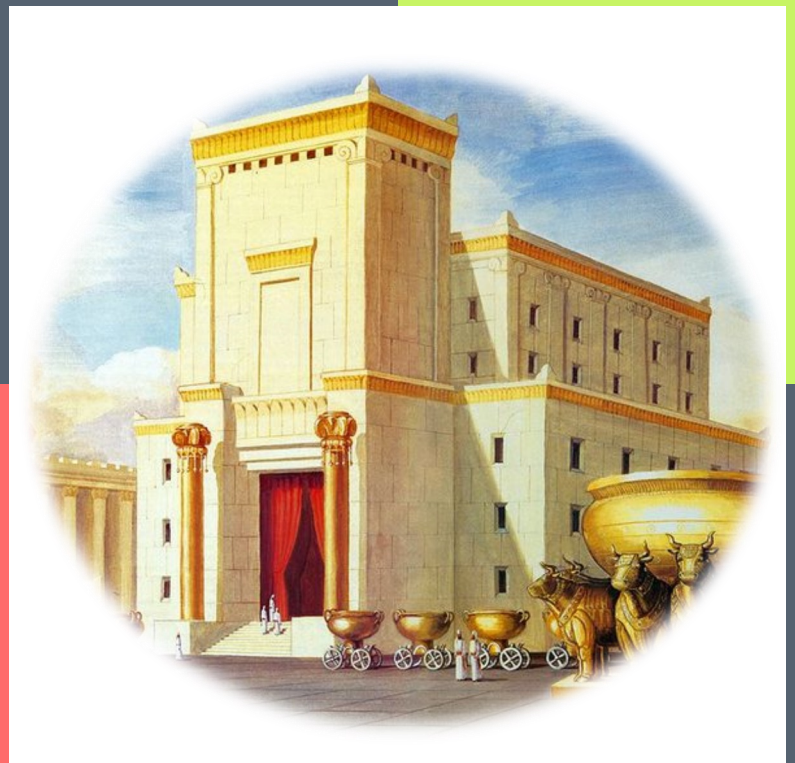
BIBLE STORY

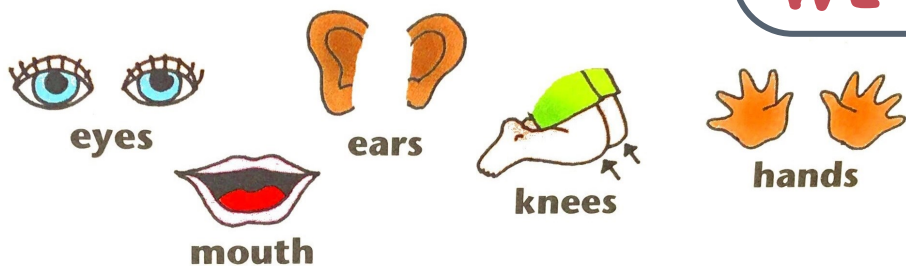
