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PURPOSE STATEMENT

The Cottonwood Creek Internship Ministry exists to provide men and women who have an assurance of God's calling on their lives, practical church ministry and life skills training under the supervision and mentorship of the ministers at Cottonwood Creek Church.

INTERNSHIP MINISTRY PLAN

Since the dawn of the church era and the Apostle Paul's diligent efforts to spread the Gospel by establishing churches throughout the known world, the Christian Church has found its driving energy in Paul's admonition "...and what you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses entrust to faithful men who will be able to teach others also." (2 Timothy 2:2) The Cottonwood Creek Internship Ministry desires to continue in these instructions.

With the knowledge that God has chosen to spread the Gospel around the world through the vehicle of the local church, it is our goal to help equip Christians by challenging them to engage in valuable ministry training through the Cottonwood Creek Church Internship Ministry.

Interns function in a unique ministry role at Cottonwood Creek Church. As you serve, this church will train, teach and transfer the ministry philosophy of Cottonwood Creek Church to you so that you may skillfully and more readily fulfill your calling. All Christians are called to ministry, whether vocationally or bi-vocationally. It's not only what we do, but who God created us to be. (Ephesians 2:10) This local body of Christ desires to continue the legacy of the ministry of Cottonwood Creek through the interns whom are trained and equipped for ministry - wherever God directs your steps.

SELECTION PROCESS FOR INTERN CANDIDATES

- 1. The applicant will submit an Internship Application to either the Hiring Minister or the Church Office (jen.nichols@cottonwoodcreek.org) for review.
- 2. Application will be reviewed by Ministry Staff.
- 3. If a potential match is identified, an interview will be scheduled with one of our ministers.
- 4. A follow-up interview will be scheduled with one of our Senior Staff Members.
- 5. Background and Reference checks will be conducted.
- 6. Official offer extended.
- 7. Start Date and Work Schedule is determined.

- Be available to assist in other ministry areas as needed
- Actively participate in all intern activities and meetings within the area of ministry in which you are serving

- Mentor and disciple interns in the study of the Bible and in personal evangelism
- Model effective staff relations and teamwork
- Add valuable assistance to the ministry of Cottonwood Creek Church
- Export well-equipped and theologically trained men and women into churches, ministries and workplaces that will influence our culture to the cause of Christ

- Guard your integrity by upholding all guidelines in the Cottonwood Creek Internship Ministry Commitment Form
- Work-related meetings with someone of the opposite sex should always take place in a public setting and should never be for an extended time
- Do not go to work-related lunches alone with the opposite sex
- Physical contact with someone of the opposite sex should honor that person and be glorifying to God
- Relationships with those of the opposite sex should exemplify the highest level of godliness

SUPERVISION

- Each intern will report to the assigned Supervising Staff Minister.
- Interns will be given care and supervision by the Supervising Staff Minister for the duration of their internship. They will report directly to that staff member on a daily basis and be involved in that area of ministry.
- All activities, actions and recommendations, individually and/or collectively, are under the authority of the church and its personnel policies and are subject to approval by our Senior Staff.

Note: Should an intern experience problems or difficulties with his or her Supervising Staff Minister, the intern should first seek to resolve the issue with that Minister. If the issue remains, the intern should schedule a meeting with Justin Frazier, Executive Pastor, Discipleship, in order to resolve the issue.

SCHEDULE

- Each intern is responsible for coordinating the weekly hour schedule with his/her supervisor. However, as with a full-time minister, interns are always on call and must be flexible in adjusting time off depending upon the needs of the church.
- Seminary/college classes during the internship must be approved by the Supervising Staff Minister.
- Because of the demands of seminary/college and of the Cottonwood Creek Church Internship Ministry, interns will not be permitted to pursue concurrent employment opportunities.

PLACEMENT

At the end of the specified term of internship, Cottonwood Creek Church will endeavor to assist those who have successfully completed their internship in beginning new endeavors. This assistance may take a variety of forms depending upon the individual's needs and circumstances.

It is worthy to note that future recommendations by the Senior Pastor and staff of Cottonwood Creek Church are valuable in future ministry placement.

DAYS OFF

All requests for time away must be made in writing and approved by the Supervising Staff Minister.

KEY DOCTRINES OF THE FAITH

<u>God</u> - God is the Creator and Ruler of the universe. He has eternally existed in three personalities: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. These three are co-equal and are one God. Genesis 1:1, 26, 27, 3:22; Psalm 90:2; Matthew 28:19; 1 Peter 1:2; 2 Corinthians 13:14

Jesus - Jesus Christ is the Son of God. He is co-equal with the Father. Jesus lived a sinless human life and offered Himself as the perfect sacrifice for the sins of all people by dying on a cross. He arose from the dead after three days to demonstrate His power over sin and death. He ascended to Heaven's glory and will return again someday to earth to reign as King of Kings, and Lord of Lords. *Matthew* 1:22-23; *Isaiah* 9:6; *John* 1:1-5; 14:10-30; *Hebrews* 4:14-15; 1 Corinthians 15:3-4; Romans 1:3-4; Acts 1:9-11; 1 Timothy 6:14-15; Titus 2:13

<u>The Holy Spirit</u> - The Holy Spirit is co-equal with the Father and the Son of God. He is present in the world to make men aware of their need for Jesus Christ. He also lives in every Christian from the moment of salvation. He provides the Christian with power for living, understanding of spiritual truth and guidance in doing what is right. He gives every believer a spiritual gift when they are saved. As Christians, we seek to live under His control daily. 2 Corinthians 3:17; John 14:16, 16:7-13, 17; Acts 1:8; 1 Corinthians 2:12, 3:16; Ephesians 1:13; Galatians 5:25; Ephesians 5:18

<u>The Bible</u> - The Bible is God's Word to us. It was written by human authors, under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit. It is the supreme source of truth for Christian beliefs and living. Because it is inspired by God, it is the truth without any mixture of error. 2 *Timothy* 3:16; 2 *Peter* 1:20-21; 2 *Timothy* 1:13; *Psalm* 119:105, 160, 12:6; *Proverbs* 30:5

<u>Human Beings</u> - People are made in the spiritual image of God, to be like Him in character. People are the supreme object of God's creation. Although every person has tremendous potential for good, all of us are marred by an attitude of disobedience toward God called "sin." This attitude separates people from God and causes many problems in life. *Genesis 1:27; Psalm 8:3-6; Isaiah 53:6a; Romans 3:23; Isaiah 59:1, 2*

<u>Salvation</u> - Salvation is God's free gift to us but we must accept it. We can never make up for our sin by self-improvement or good works. Only by trusting in Jesus Christ as God's offer of forgiveness can anyone be saved from sin's penalty. When we turn from our self-ruled life and turn to Jesus in faith, we are saved. Eternal life begins the moment one receives Jesus Christ into his life by faith. *Romans* 6:23; *Ephesians* 2:8-9; *John* 14:6, 1:12; *Titus* 3:5; *Galatians* 3:26; *Romans* 5:1

Eternal Security - Because God gives us eternal life through Jesus Christ, the true believer is secure in that salvation for eternity. If you have been genuinely saved, you cannot "lose" it. Salvation is maintained by the grace and power of God, not by the self-effort of the Christians. It is the grace and keeping power of God that gives us this security. *John* 10:29; 2 *Timothy* 1:12; *Hebrews* 7:25, 10:10, 14; 1 Peter 1:3-5

<u>Eternity</u> - People were created to exist forever. We will either exist eternally separated from God by sin, or eternally with God through forgiveness and salvation. To be eternally

separated from God is Hell. To be eternally in union with Him is eternal life. Heaven and Hell are real places of eternal existences. John 3:16; John 14:17; Romans 6:23; Romans 8:17-18; Revelation 20:15; 1 Corinthians 2:7-9

- Assist in cooperative efforts with other ministries of the church when available

Year-Round Intern Pay Scale

Internship Levels - Determined by hourly requirements

Level 5	31 - 40 hrs per week
Level 4	25 - 30 hrs per week
Level 3	16 - 24 hrs per week
Level 2	10 - 15 hrs per week
Level 1	1 - 9 hrs per week

The current hourly rate for both Year-Round and Summer Internships is \$12/hour.

* Year-Round Internships are a maximum of 12 months in duration. However, both Interns and Resident Interns may apply for a new internship at the end of the 12 months.

Summer Internship

Summer Internships can be any level between Level 1 and Level 5, but typically only work between May and August in a given year.

Resident Intern Criteria

Resident Intern positions are reserved for special situations that require additional investment as we equip future ministers and missionaries for ministry.

Some of these qualifications include:

- Advanced work experience
- Theological education
- Pursuing a full-time call to vocational ministry
- Current Ministry License or Ordination
