
Noah Builds a Boat MY FIRST TAKE HOME SHEET

CAN IT FLOAT?

Find two clear glasses you can see through. Then gather objects from around the house that can be place in water. Fill the glasses with water. Allow your child to guess which items might float and which would sink. Talk about how Noah obeyed God and how the ark with all the animals inside floated on water.

Have you had to stay indoors on a rainy day? Think about Noah with hundreds of anxious animals and not a lot of room to play. On days when you have eager little hands waiting for something exciting to do, pull out a box of rain day fun. Here are some ideas to get you started. Put together an indoor sandbox. In a box, put rice or dried beans with spoons and cups. Finger paint with yogurt or pudding and then eat your artwork! String cereal to make a necklace. Create an indoor picnic.

On rainy days, you may have to make sunshine with your children. It's not hard to do when you remember together that God cares for us—in both the sunshine and the rain.



As you color the picture, talk about how God wants us to obey Him.


What did God tell Noah to do?

Who took care of Noah?


Match the animals and then color them.

- Color the cows green.


