



ABRAHAM & SARAH HAVE A BABY

BABY/ TODDLER LESSON

BIBLE POINT:

God wants us to trust Him.

BIBLE VERSE:

"I am God all-powerful. Obey me and live the right way." Genesis 17:1



SCHEDULE

Activity

Prayer

Worship

Bible Story

Craft

ACTIVITY:

Talk to your child about the Bible. Talk about how it is God's Word. We read it so we can learn about God and what God wants us to do. God wants us to share with others.

Provide a baby doll or teddy for your child. Talk about ways to care for babies (feeding, dressing, wrapping, rocking to sleep, etc.) Help your child act out those ways to care and love a baby. Say, "Today we are going to learn about the promise God made to Abraham and Sarah. We can trust in God because He always keeps His promises."

PRAYER:

It is so important that you pray with your baby/toddler. Pray for your child's salvation. Demonstrate how to pray, folding your hands, bowing your head. Teaching prayer begins during infancy. You may pray yourself or use the following prayer.

Prayer: "Dear God, thank you for this day. We are so happy we can trust in you and the plans you have for us. We love you. In Jesus' name we pray, Amen."

WORSHIP:

Sing "**Father Abraham**".

While singing with your baby/toddler, rock them back and forth and interact with them. Let them learn that singing songs about the Lord is a wonderful sweet way to learn about God and bond with you.



BIBLE STORY:

Hold up the Bible, "**This is the Bible. We love our Bible. It is the Word of God. The Bible is truth.**" Hug the Bible to your chest. "**Let's pat our Bible.**" Take the baby/toddler's hand and have them pat the Bible. Read the story with enthusiasm to capture their attention.

Babies and Toddlers:

Hold up the teaching picture attached to this lesson or read the story from a Children's Bible. Story comes from Genesis 18,21.

"Abraham loved God very much. He loved praying to God and talking to Him every day. God blessed Abraham by giving him lots of land. But there was one thing Abraham wanted more than anything else in the WHOLE world. Abraham wanted his wife, Sarah, to have a baby. Abraham remembered the night God spoke to him and said he would have a son, lots of sons. Abraham laughed because Sarah was already too old to be having a baby! Sarah spent a lot of time making warm blankets and snuggly baby clothes. They wanted a baby so much and guess what!

Sarah and Abraham had a baby boy! They were so happy. They had a baby boy just like God promised they would. They named their baby boy, Issac, which means laughter. The baby brought so much happiness to Abraham and Sarah.

TIME TO TALK:

As you change diapers, wash hands, rock, play with, and console your baby/toddler take time to talk about the Bible story.
