


Ruth & Naomi

I Can Love Others

Ask a parent or adult to read the questions to you. Think about an answer for each question. Ask them to help you write the answers on the blank lines.

Family Fun

Teach your child how important it is to care for others. Here is a challenge you can give to your preschooler(s) at home to teach them how to show love and care for others:

Each day, challenge your child to find one way to help someone else. It can be as simple as a small chore at home, or as big as delivering food and a card to an elderly or ill shut-in (it can be fun to do things like this with a parent or trusted adult!)

Showing kindness to a sibling, cleaning up without being prompted, or surprising a friend or extended family member with an impromptu visit and a warm hug are also great ways to show love and care. Encourage your child to look for ways to make others feel loved and act on it!

HEART SCAVENGER HUNT.

Make several construction paper hearts and write on each of them something your child does or says that makes you feel loved and cared for. Hide them around the house and encourage your child to find them all. Read aloud as each is found.
