# Shepherds Visit Jesus Bring this back next Sunday for a special treat!

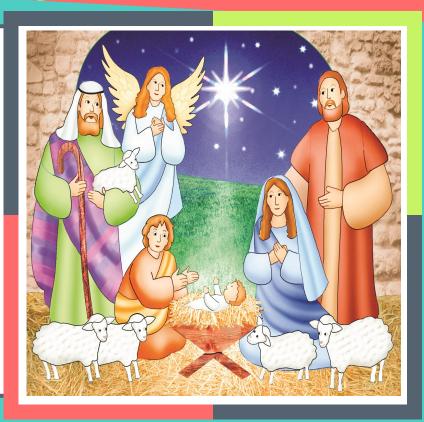
### BIBLE STORY

### FAMILY FUN

Next, make a list of some safe people children can talk to about Jesus. Think of people who need to know about Jesus. Then like the shepherds, tell what you have seen and heard!
