

A couple of months ago, I was hired to help an elderly woman move into an assisted living facility. Her son needed help organizing her new space and getting her settled into this new chapter of life.

Her name is Murrel.

She's 90 years old—fiery, feisty, and full of life (and I love it).

After moving her in, her son asked if I would continue visiting her once a week as a companion. What began as a simple job quickly became something far more meaningful.
