Activity Option 1

Bible Focus: Saul's Great Basket Escape

Verse: "They continue to tell the Good News...That Jesus is Christ."

Bible Point: My church helps me and I help my church.

Supplies:

Precut Saul
and Bible
Verse Tag

Pre-Hole-
punched
paper bag

Yarn

Crayons/
Markers

Glue Sticks

Today we learned how **Saul's friends** helped him escape a city that wanted to hurt him for telling about **Jesus**. He was lowered down through an opening in the city wall in a **basket!**

Let's make a craft that helps remind us how God kept **Saul** safe from harm!



Directions:

1. Give each child a precut Paul, a paper bag, a piece of yarn, and a Bible verse tag.
2. Encourage them to color Saul and decorate their basket using crayons or markers.
3. Once they are finished, show them how to slip the yarn/string through the precut holes on the other side of the paper bag and tie it in two knots.
4. Help them staple or tape
5. Saul to the inside of the bag.
6. Lastly, have the children glue the Bible verse tag to the front of their "basket".
